

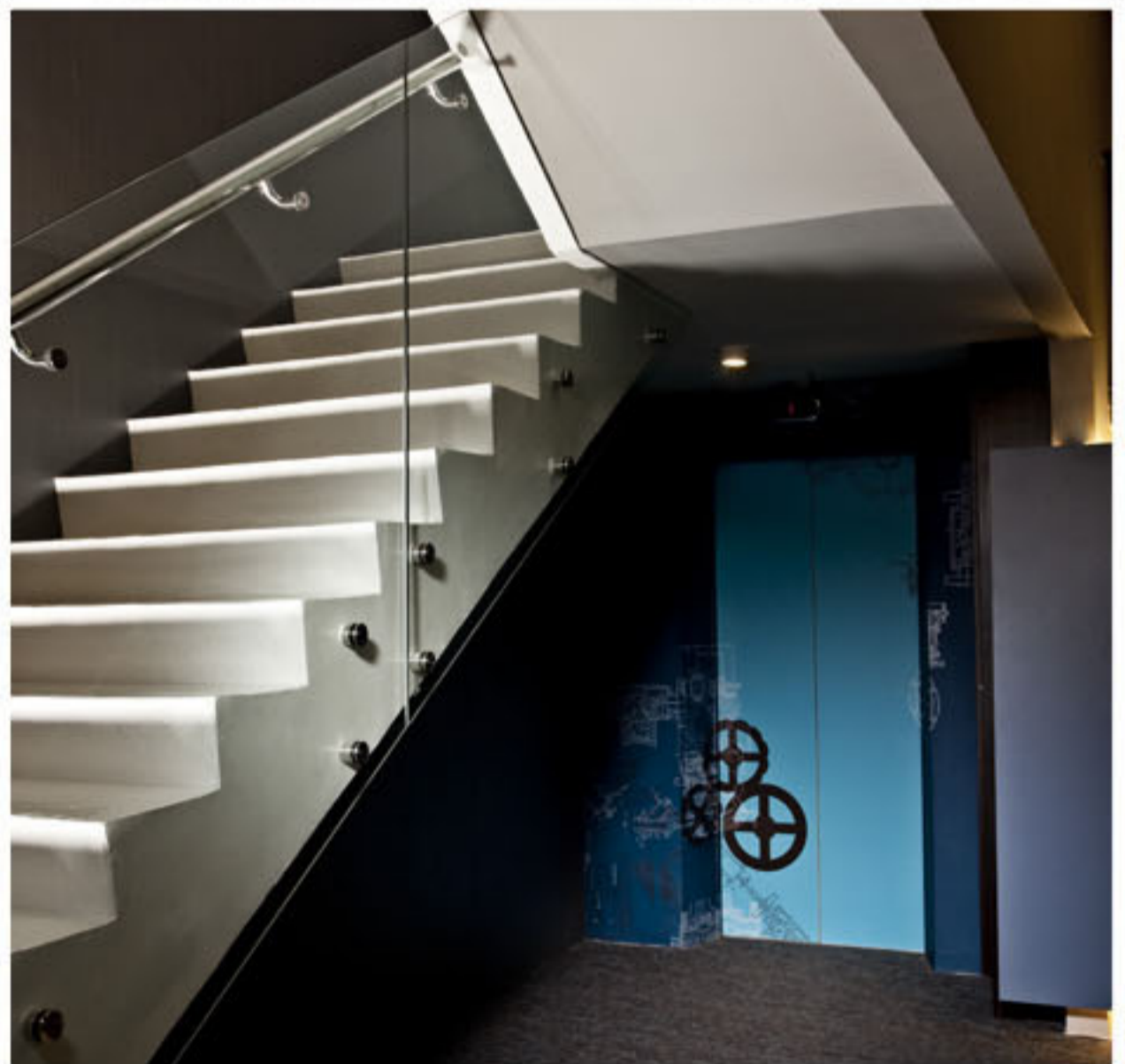

The once fairly ordinary premises were transformed into a modern, trendy space by interior designer and visual communication specialist Pride Studio. Blue LED strip lights illuminate the frosted glass reception counter, while a timber-paneled feature wall, L-shaped sofas and an ottoman add to the contemporary flavour of the offices.
